A "MOST CHALLENGING SCHOOL"




In the Washington Post's list of America's Most Challenging High School, St. Francis ranks ninth in the state. The ranking is based on the number of college-level tests given at a school each year divided by the number of seniors who graduated. This year, only 11 percent of the approximately 22,000 U.S. public high schools earned placement on the list.


ACTON INSTITUTE RESOURCES IN ACTION

Over the past eight years, high school staff members have attended Acton University. These unique intellectual sessions increase staff knowledge of philosophy, theology and economics – helping shape classroom instruction in government, history, economics and religion classes.



THEOLOGY OF THE BODY

Middle and high school teachers receive training in "Theology of the Body," a positive view of human sexuality based on the teachings of Saint John Paul II the Great. Students in grades 7-12 explore such questions as, "What is the purpose of life," and "What does the marital union say about God and his plan for our lives?"



FAITH FULL FORMATION

According to ACRE, an assessment tool that gauges knowledge of religious beliefs and practices, GTACS students are far more proficient than their peers in the Catholic faith.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Approximately 35% of GTACS students receive financial assistance at some level, impacting approximately 175 different families.

MAKING THE GRADE

St. Francis High School graduates have earned placements at many prestigious colleges and universities, including US military academies.

OPEN TO NON-CATHOLICS

In any given year, 5-10% of students enrolled at GTACS are from non-Catholic families.
