Full day preschool childrens' start time is 7:50 am and end time is 2:40 pm which aligns with all of GTACS. Half day student dismissal time is 11:00 am. There are options for full day for 3's, 4's and early 5's (Pre-K). When dropping your child off in the morning and you arrive after carline ends, for your child's safety, you must walk your child to their classroom.

Our day includes table time, large group time, prayer, story time and more. Teachers will present content in the morning, when kids are most receptive, but will continue to offer guided activities, story, and indoor/outdoor play for full day students.

Preschool packets were mailed and should be to your soon! It will contain a lot of important information for your family! If you do not receive a packet, please contact our office! Before school starts, we ask that you schedule a 15 minute classroom visit and conference with your child's teacher. This will help your child feel more comfortable and give us insights to start the new school year. Please contact your child's teacher by email (their email address is listed by their name) to set up a mutually convenient time during one of the following days (please plan to

attend with your child): Wednesday, August 30th (PM) and Thursday, August 31st (AM & PM). The green health forms can be turned dropped off at the school office or you can bring them to your conference. Your child's conference is also a great time to bring in her/his supplies and get that checked off your list!

Tuition for September is due September 1st. Please remit before or on that date.

First grade is such an exciting time in the eyes of our students as they move upstairs and get a locker! They are assigned their own desk area at specific tables.

In 1st Grade, they continue to build and expand on their phonics and reading skills, as well as introducing additional comprehension skills that they began in Kindergarten, utilizing the same reading series. There is an increased focus on writing skills including written responses to the question of the week.

In Math, 1st Graders continue to build on their understanding of math concepts, including addition, subtraction, geometric shapes, measurement, time, basic fractions, and money.

First Grade Religion is so pure basic and true. We start the year teaching them about the Mass, which leads into our study of God our loving Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, which then flows right into our study of our Church as a community. It is during this year that 1st Graders will have their first opportunity to have a part in the Mass ministries. This is also the year that students begin using a daily planner to learn organization and also have nightly homework.

Our wonderful first grade team will lovingly guide your children through this year of academic learning and added responsibility. These teachers will greet their students outside the Cass Street doors on the first day of school, September 5.

Second grade is truly a special year! This is the year that reading and math skills are enhanced to make them more independent learners. You will be amazed at their writing skills during the year!

Although in 2nd grade we continue to teach decoding skills for reading, we also teach valuable reading strategies and higher levels of comprehension skills that will help each student become lifelong readers in the different areas of literacy. These skills are vital as they progress to a higher level of learning where they are "reading" to learn.

In Math, 2nd Graders will learn higher levels of addition and subtraction skills along with beginning multiplication tables. They will also learn problem solving skills and will be brought to a higher level in measurement, time, fractions and money as they are taught to connect these concepts to everyday life.

At FROG Time they will lead the school in praise and worship hand motions and will be in skits to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

This great team of teachers will be ready to greet their new students on the playground, Tuesday, September 5th. Students will line-up outside the 10th Street door every morning.

Third grade is an amazing year of increased independence. Students will receive outstanding support as they become more self-sufficient learners and read across the curriculum. All throughout K-2, your students have been learning to read, so that in 3rd Grade and beyond, they can read to learn!

Math finds your student learning out of a text book for the first time! This is exciting and challenging all at once! Solid addition and subtraction skills will lead to greater advances in multiplication, division, problem solving, multistep equations and more.

Reading/Spelling uses Reading Street as a guide to learning. Comprehension skills and strategies, along with grammar skills, will be highlighted each week. A spelling packet will also be given each week with a Spelling test on Friday. Your 3rd Grader will also have an accelerated reader reading requirement each quarter. This is a program in which students can read books and then take quizzes on them to earn points.

Writing follows the Six +1 Traits program. Daily writing lessons will teach individual parts of the writing process with a culminating writing assignment on Friday.

This year in the *We Believe* program, we will journey together towards a deeper understanding of our religious beliefs and traditions. The textbook will supplement mini units throughout the year as we follow the Church

calendar. Students will become more familiar with the Bible as they look up daily readings and verses during Morning Prayer time.

Social Studies and Science are taught through mini units each quarter. Map skills, the Scientific Method, Ecosystems and Weather are all covered.

The fantastic team of Third Grade teachers will be anxiously awaiting students on the playground, Tuesday, September 5th. 3rd Graders will be lining up outside the 10th Street doors every morning.

Saint Joseph's Club

We will enter our 4th year offering the St. Joseph's Club before and after school care for Holy Angels students. This gives us the opportunity to extend our schools' beliefs throughout the school day. Our program is modeled on the outstanding example given us by Joseph, who loved Jesus as his own child.

Three year olds through 3rd Graders who are enrolled at Holy Angels are eligible to participate. Sign-up for all ages can be done on a week-by-week basis; however, we are asking parents to commit by Thursday at 8 am for the week ahead. Families will be billed weekly for St. Joseph Club usage. St. Joseph's Club will also cover "snow days," certain parts of Christmas and spring breaks, and select professional development days. Separate sign-up will be required.

The required paper work can be filled out when our School offices open on August 21st and during the Back to School information night on August 28th and any time after that.

Back-to-School Information Night

The Holy Angels Preschool & Elementary School Back to School Night is scheduled for Monday, August 28th from 6:30-7:30. Preschool, Kindergarten parents/children, and any new families to the school system should stop in the school office to be given guidance on important information to obtain from the booths. Booths for all of the various programs offered by GTACS will be set up for all families to ask any questions and to gather information. There will be lemonade and cookies served compliments of our Parent Activity

Committee (PAC)! Enjoy a treat while you go booth to booth to gather information. Also during this time students can reconnect with friends, look over class placement lists, and visit their classroom and meet their Teacher. Classroom Placement lists will be posted on the Cass Street doors by 8:00 a.m. on the 28th. Our hope is that by meeting teachers and seeing friends before the first day of school, it will reduce the natural anxiety created by this exciting day. Please know that all are welcome for this fun social gathering!

Morning Drop-off Procedures

We will begin the school day at 7:50 a.m. and end at 2:40 p.m. Students may arrive on the playground as early as 7:30 a.m., as supervision begins at that time. Our staff will greet you in the parking lot every morning between 7:30 and 7:45 a.m. to help children out of vehicles. Please do not drop off children before 7:30 a.m., as our staff is in Morning Prayer and there is no supervision until this time. (If you need childcare services before 7:30 a.m., please contact the St. Joseph's Club regarding early morning care that begins at 6:30 a.m.) Preschool, Kindergarten and 1st grade students are encouraged to be dropped off (in a single file car line) in the parking lot off 11th Street. 2nd grade and 3rd grade students may be dropped off by the fence on 10th Street. The drop off location has been moved down to the further playground fence openings towards Cass so there is more room to accommodate the two grade levels this year. If you have a 2nd or 3rd Grader who has K or 1st siblings, they may all be dropped off at the 10th St. drop-off. Preschool students must be picked up in the parking lot off 11th Street.

When dropping your child off in the AM and you arrive after carline ends, you must walk your child to their classroom for preschool children and for K-3rd to the office. This is for the safety of your child.

Please do not park on the residential side of 10th Street during drop off or dismissal as the busses and moving traffic cannot make it easily down the street. We truly appreciate your cooperation in making our morning routine safe and smooth. Please be reminded that the morning bell rings at 7:45 a.m. Students are considered tardy after 7:50 a.m. Another reminder: if you arrive after students have gone inside, please walk your child into the office to receive a tardy slip.

Afternoon Pick-up Procedures

Preschool, Kindergarten and 1st grade will be picked up in the 11th Street parking lot. Please enter the parking lot from 11th Street and exit right onto Cass. Please form two lines for pick up.

This traffic flow pattern should be followed at all times for the safety of our students. Our 2nd and 3rd graders along with siblings will be picked up on 10th Street in a car pool line by the fence with the exception of Preschool. All Preschool students must be picked up in the parking lot off 11th Street.

If you have two or more students in our school, please pick up at the designated area of the oldest student.

Please do not park on 10th Street and walk across the street to pick your child up, as this creates an unsafe environment. Please place a **bold print sign** in your car window with your child's name on it to help the line move efficiently.
