Grade Level Expectations

Sixth grade is a year of transition; making friends and making good choices. Classes switch for differing content areas and organization is a key to their individual success. Students begin to explore leadership opportunities within the school culture.

Seventh grade is a year of independence and fine tuning organizational and listening skills. Students have acclimated to middle school and they handle the changing of classes with ease. They begin to grow in their focus on academics and continue to need social/emotional support in order to embrace the demands of their intellectual needs.

Eighth grade is a year of continued growth and independence as they prepare for the rigor of the coming years in high school. Their actions and deeds are watched closely by their younger peers and they begin showing their spiritual maturity and social/emotional growth. As leaders, they enjoy Christian service both on and off campus.

Middle School Teaming

Teaming at the middle school level has a different emphasis than the teaming that occurs in the elementary school setting. Interdisciplinary teaming is defined as a group of teachers from *different* subject areas who plan and work together and who share the same students for a significant portion of the school day. This approach is intended to create a context that enables students and teachers to know one another better and help teachers better support and understand the educational needs of each student.

Teams generally focus on the following: coordinating lesson plans, sharing and discussing student progress, designing and reviewing common assessments, solving challenges, and integrating subjects around a central theme or idea. This cohesive atmosphere has proven to be a vital component of strong middle schools across the nation. High functioning teams enjoy great rewards for their collaborative work; the greatest coming in the form of student achievement scores and personal growth for all.

They will focus on specific topics, such as: Orientation of Students, Goal Setting, Organizational Skills, Study and Skill Reinforcements, Conferences regarding Grades/Assessments and Self Advocacy, Building Group Identity and Belonging, and Christ-centered activities to promote our community here at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, as well as the broader community. Both Course 3 and Algebra Readiness will continue to serve as the preparatory class for Algebra I and students will be placed in the class that will best suit their needs as a learner. Both classes will continue to be the last class before Algebra I.

Counseling Services

As we continue to be developmentally responsive to your child's needs both in and out of the classroom, we are blessed to have the services of Mrs. Ginny Newman, our school counselor. Mrs. Newman works closely with our teachers and parents to ensure a successful school year for our students. Her door is always open!

Enrichment/Exploratory Opportunities

Every solid middle school provides enriching opportunities for students to gain exposure to and experience non-curricular activities. Due to the confinements of our school day, our students must choose from a variety of options to meet their individual needs. Each year we try to address our time issues and continue to explore the best ways to serve our students, exposing them to broad activities while expanding on their growing talents. Students will enjoy two (regular) class periods (44 min.) of enrichment/exploratory class offering per day.

Enrichment Course selections were made in the spring of last year. While we always try to accommodate the greatest number of students the best we can, flexibility and cooperation are asked of all.

A full year of Band is offered to any interested student grades 6-8. Band will once again be taught by Mr. Charles Taylor. Mr. Taylor is an accomplished musician as well as an exceedingly motivating and knowledgeable "music man." Mr. Taylor has also served GTACS as principal of both Immaculate Conception and St. Francis High Schools, and as the Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Gaylord. All bands saw great improvement and success under Mr. Taylor's direction last year and we look forward to their continued success.

This year we are able to offer Spanish for all sixth graders for one quarter (9 weeks), along with computers, keyboarding, and art. Each sixth grade (non Band) student will take one quarter of each of these enrichment courses this year.

To build on the foreign language progress of our middle school students, we will offer a year of Spanish to our seventh graders, along with computers, computer programming, art, and physical education. Our 8th grade students will have the option to take a full year of Spanish. Those not in band or Spanish will rotate through computers and art or physical education.

Christian Service

The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Middle School is a community centered in Christ. As Christ did, we lead and encourage students to extend themselves into the community through our Christian Service Hours Program. This program promotes Christian attitudes toward service in a variety of situations. We make available to the students a variety of possible projects which will enable them to serve and meet these requirements. In addition, students can independently, with the guidance of their Religion teacher, choose an appropriate project within our community. The complete objectives and requirements may be found on pgs. 6-8 of our student handbook. After accomplishing service hours, students will complete a Christian Service Hours form which can be downloaded from the GTACS website.

Uniforms

The wearing of a Catholic School uniform helps students identify with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Middle School, and reflects the unity we share in our love for Christ. Not only do our students take individual pride in their cleanliness and neatness, they do so reflecting this unity as a community. It is the collective responsibility of all (parents, students, and staff) to ensure the uniform applies to each student. In addition to uniform parameters, **please note that hair is to be clean and neatly groomed, out of the eyes, and (boys) off the collar.** Please help ensure that the uniform is respected and held in the highest regard by reviewing pgs. 33-35 in the Student Handbook. Thank you for your support in helping us focus on your child's academic and spiritual growth.

11th Hour

As we continue to support students in the areas of responsibility and work ethic, we will continue to offer 11th hour on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday after school until 3:45. All students that have an unexcused missing assignment must attend 11th hour (the following day/session) from 2:45-3:45. Further, your child may miss athletic practice or club meetings.
