NEW SCHOOL MOVES FORWARD GROUNDBREAKING AND DEMOLITION TAKE PLACE

The June 1, 2017 groundbreaking ceremony began with a very special Mass celebrating the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Teacher in the Spirit. A box of campaign blessings, sacrifices and prayers was brought to Mass and then carried by students to the groundbreaking site. Bishop Steven Raica performed the Order of Blessing, and sprinkled the site of our new school with holy water. The Bishop, surrounded by pastors representing our five supporting parishes, turned the first spade of dirt. Later, members of the campaign cabinet and other supporters joined in this momentous occasion and many photos were taken!





Between August 18-21, the "old school" portion of the building was demolished. St. Francis High School students Jon Boehmer, Ryan Lynts, Tyler Pritchard and Dylan McCardel helped carry the cornerstone out for safekeeping until it is installed in a place of honor at the new building.

GTACS MAKES ITS MARK

CATHOLIC EDUCATION FOUNDATION NAMES GTACS TO ITS HALL OF FAME

At a September 2017 awards ceremony in Manhattan, the Catholic Education Foundation – a national, non-profit association dedicated to the advancement of Catholic education in the United States – GTACS was one of two schools entered into the organization's Hall of Fame; the other school was The Atonement Academy of San Antonio. The Dominican Sisters of St. Cecelia were also named to the Hall of Fame. Also at the ceremony, the Catholic Education Foundation bestowed Lifetime Achievement Awards on Rev. Msgr. Sabato Pilato of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and Dr. William Thierfelder, president of Belmont Abbey College in Charlotte, North Carolina.

The Catholic Education Foundation is guided by distinguished Catholic education leaders of our day including: Cardinal Séan Patrick O'Malley, Archbishop of Boston; and Frank J. Hanna, CEO, Hanna Capital, LTD; Most Reverend Charles J. Chaput, OFM Cap, Archbishop of Philadelphia; and Most Reverend Donald W. Wuerl, Archbishop of Washington.



The Class of 2017 set another record with their average ACT score: Their composite of 26.4 is 6+ points above the national average (state scores are no longer valid as many schools in Michigan now take the SAT instead of the ACT). Since the ACT is based on a 36-point scale, incremental improvements mean greater likelihod of admission to the college of one's choice, and access to more scholarship dollars. The Class of 2017 received \$3.2 million in scholarship offers.

TO LOVE AND TO SERVE

St. Francis High School students are now required to complete at least one Christian mission trip immersion experience prior to graduation. The students' response to this opportunity has been amazing, and most mission trips have had waiting lists! Students and their families must pay for the trips themselves, and costs range from \$250 to \$2,000 for international experiences.

Meanwhile, girls track won the conference AND regionals, and girls tennis won the conference. This fall, the Gladiator girls cross country team won the conference and regionals, finishing 9th overall in the State. For the first time maybe ever, the boys cross country team also made it to States – and with a very young team, too! Girls volleyball had a terrific year, taking conference and district titles. The equestrian team won their regionals and quarterfinals. Boys tennis broke nearly every school record imaginable, with three individual State champions and the highest overall team score in Gladiator history. A NOTEWORTHY YEAR

Congratulations to the St. Francis Wind Ensemble for earning highest ratings at the March 2017 Band & Orchestra Festival.
