ANOTHER NOTEWORTHY YEAR

Marching Band had a great season last year. The band performed a show based on the music from the movie sensation *La La Land*. The music arranger for the MSU Marching Band, Mr. Jeff Kressler, was commissioned to arrange music specifically for the St. Francis Marching Band. Mr. Charles Taylor and Mr. Kressler began working on the project in early June and after a few amendments and adjustments to the original submission the final score and all individual parts were completed and delivered in time for the band camp the first week of August. The drill design was also commissioned by Mr. Patrick Ruddy, one of the most sought after designers in the Midwest. The band enjoyed working on the show and was proud to perform the full *La La Land* program at Homecoming.

The Wind Ensemble also continued to enjoy great success earning the highest ratings at last year's District Band & Orchestra Festival that was held in Elk Rapids on March 2. Consistent with the evaluations of the previous three years, all four judges that critiqued the band enthusiastically praised the ensemble citing:

Attention to details, balance & blend, dynamic contrast & musical expression-Bravo!

Excellent instruction, keep doing what you are doing!

This now marks the fourth year in a row that the band has earned straight A's at the District Festival, a goal that was achieved for the first time in the history of the band program four years ago.

In the 11th year of revitalizing our high school musical program, the 2018 show of *Thoroughly Modern Millie* had at or near sold-out capacities and generated rave reviews.
