### WEDNESDAY

• DAILY Sound Review – Have your child run through their sounds! Please pause after each if possible so your child can echo the correct sound. Practice make PERMANENT!

- Use/Reprint the Fluency Kit. Read Page 3 (jog, thick, pen,...) (Please see my email from 4/5/20 or 4/14/20, for this document). Have your child read the REAL WORDS and record his or her score at the bottom for today.
- Print and read the passage <u>A Bath for the Pup</u> on Page 3 of the Passages packet. (See my email from 4/5/20 or 4/14, 20, for this passage). After reading, have your child:
  - 1. Highlight or use a light crayon to color all of the SHORT VOWELS in the passage (ă, ĕ, ĭ, ŏ, and ŭ).
  - 2. Use a pencil to circle the double letters (ff, ll, ss, zz).

- **Read** <u>A Bath for the Pup</u> again. Try the reading comprehension questions below. Please have your child underline the evidence for his or her answer.
  - 1. Who is the main character? What is the beginning sound of that name?
  - 2. What is the pup's name? What letter does that name begin with? What sound?
  - 3. Why did the pup need a bath?
