Every Saturday throughout the year, you can find families and students from GTACS working together at the St. Francis High School to make lunch for those who are homeless and in need of a meal as part of a program called Glad Meals. Glad Meals is part of the region's community meals program and was established in 2003 by two St. Francis High School students. Boots for Kids

We collect donations of new hats, mittens, and socks to keep children warm from head to toe. Boots for Kids is a wonderful Christian service opportunity for our students to help other children. Boots for Kids began approximately 40 years ago at Blondie's restaurant near Chum's Corner and is now an effort that's supported by many organizations, individuals, businesses, and civic clubs. Boots for Kids works directly with school officials and social agencies to identify children to receive boots, mittens, a hat, socks, and dental supplies.

Traverse City Fire Department Toy Drive

Students are invited to bring in an unwrapped toy. The Fire Department gathers the donations and shares them with families in need in our community during the Christmas season.

GTACS Vocations Fund

The Vocations Fund provides financial assistance for students who are exploring a vocation to the religious life. For example, if a young man or woman is considering becoming a priest or religious sister and wishes to visit a seminary or religious community as part of their discernment, they can apply for travel assistance from this fund.

Saint Francis High School Missions

Proceeds will help defray costs not covered by participant fees such a transportation, chaperones, and financial assistance for students.

8th grade Mission Trip - Armed Forces Retirement Home

As part of their trip to Washington, DC, to learn more about our nation and its founding principles, 8th graders make an outreach visit and monetary donation to the Armed Forces Retirement Home (www.afrh.gov).

5th grade Service Trip - Feeding America Food Bank

Our 5th graders travel every spring to Grand Rapids to Feeding America of West Michigan Food Bank and volunteer by packing food to distribute to 40 counties. This is a national non-profit clearing house that provides food to more than 400,000 people every year. The donations go to offset the cost of the travel expenses, along with a donation to the food bank. We are thankful to fulfill Jesus' mission of feeding the hungry.

Grand Traverse Area Right to Life

This is a non-partisan organization dedicated to the peaceful protection of human life from conception to natural death. We are pleased to be able to support their efforts to educate and advocate on behalf of all of God's children.

McNulty Academy in Kenya

Funds collected are used to support Alumni-founded KMMA-CAITHS in Kenya. Kieran McNulty, PhD (SF '91) and Katie Maxbauer McNulty (SF'93) co-founded in 2016 the Kathy & Mike McNulty Academy on Rusinga Island, Lake Victoria in Western Kenya.
